

All Fridays in Lent at 6:30pm in Spanish and 7:15pm in English

Walking the Stations of the Cross is a significant devotional practice, particularly during the season of Lent. It commemorates the journey of Jesus Christ from his condemnation to his crucifixion and burial. This practice consists of fourteen stations, each representing a specific event along this path.

The Stations of the Cross serve as a way to meditate

on and reflect upon the passion and sacrifice of Jesus. It allows believers to enter into the narrative of Christ's suffering, fostering a deeper understanding and appreciation of his love and redemption.

During this devotional practice, individuals typically move from one station to another, either physically or symbolically, pausing at each station to pray and contemplate on the corresponding event. The stations often include depictions or images representing the specific moment, aiding in visualization and connection to the narrative.

By engaging in the Stations of the Cross, Catholics seek to unite themselves with Christ's journey, acknowledging their own sins and weaknesses while finding solace in his sacrifice. It is an opportunity for believers to express their gratitude, seek forgiveness, and renew their commitment to follow Christ's teachings.



This devotion is to offer reparations to the Sacred Heart of Jesus

St Margaret Mary Alacoque was asked by Our Lord to spread devotion to His Most Sacred Heart. May 1688, St Margaret Mary wrote a letter to Mother Superior what is called The Great Promise Our Lord made regarding the Nine First Fridays

"On a Friday during Holy Communion, I promise you, in the excessive mercy of my Heart that my all powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on the first Friday for nine consecutive months, the grace of final repentance, they shall not die in my disgrace nor without receiving the Sacraments; my divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in that last moment" —Our Lord to St. Margaret Mary

Conditions to fulfill the Great Promise:

- 1. They must be made on nine consecutive First Fridays of the month
- 2. They must receive Holy Communion; this assumes that the person is in the state of grace.
- 3. The communicant should have the intention, at least implicitly, of making reparations to the Sacred Heart of Jesus for all the sinfulness and ingratitude of men.

The Twelve Promises Our Lord made to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque to those who practice the Nine First Fridays are:

- 1. I will give them all the graces necessary for their sate of life.
- 2. I will establish peace in their families.
- 3. I will console them in all their troubles.
- 4. They shall find in My Heart an assured refuge during life and especially at the hour of their death.
- 5. I will pour abundant blessings on all their undertakings.
- 6. Sinners shall find in My Heart the source of an infinite ocean of mercy.
- 7. Lukewarm souls shall become fervent.
- 8. Reverent souls shall speedily rise to great perfection.
- 9. I will bless the homes where an image of My Heart shall b exposed and honored.
- 10. I will Give to devotees of My Heart the power of touching the most hardened hearts.
- 11. Those who propagate this deviant shall have their names written in My Heart, never to be effaced.
- 12. The all-powerful love Of My Heart will grant to all those who shall receive Communion o the First Friday of nine consecrate months the grace of final repentance; they call not die under My displeasure, not without receiving their Sacrament' My Heart shall be their assured refuge at the last hour.

"Five First Saturdays"

First Saturday Devotion is a practice that involves attending Mass and receiving Holy Communion on the first Saturday of each month, as an act of reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. This devotion is based on the apparitions of the Virgin Mary to the three shepherd children in Fatima, Portugal, in 1917.

During these apparitions, Mary requested the observance of the Fist Saturday devotion as a means to console her Immaculate Heart, which is often wounded by the sins of humanity.

Why five?

Jesus told Sr. Lucia there are 5 kinds of offenses and blasphemies against the Immaculate Heart of Mary:

- 1. Against the Immaculate Conception of Mary
- 2. Against Mary's Virginity
- 3. Against Mary's Divine Maternity and her Motherhood of all mankind
- 4. Turning children against Mary as their heavenly Mother
- 5. Against Mary's Sacred images



To fulfill Our Lady's request on the first Saturday for 5 Consecutive months the following 4 separate practices must be completed with the intention of making reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary:

- 1. Go to Confession (within 8 days before or after the First Saturday)
- 2. Receive Holy Communion,
- 3. Pray five decades of the Rosary,
- 4. Keep Our Lady company for 15 minutes while meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary.

Sacred Heart will celebrate first Saturdays each month beginning February 3.

Daily Mass at 8am

Confessions will be offered after the Mass.

This opportunity will help deepen your relationship with God and to seek forgiveness for personal sins and the sins of the world.

Meditating on the mysteries can be confusing or difficult, but doable. Just spend 15 minutes with Our Lady thinking about one or some of the mysteries of the rosary. This doesn't mean you need to meditate on all 15 mysteries in one Saturday. You can choose to meditate on one mystery at a time. For instance, your First Saturday can be on the first mystery, your second Saturday can be the second mystery and so on.

The purpose of this group is to grow in love and unity within our local community. Serving Christ together, in humility and dedication.

The name *Totus Tuus* was a term used by Pope St. John Paul II. He used it in referencing to Our Lady. He knew that by giving himself totally to her daily, she would lead him closer and more perfectly to her Son Jesus. Transforming his heart little by little, making it more like the heart of Christ.

When looking at his life, it is obvious that he (JPII) had

an incredible relationship with our Lord, guiding him in his entire life – allowing him to lead the Church, as a whole, toward greater unity and love. He learned to see the world through a lens of love rather than fear. "Be not afraid", we hope to follow in this practice.
